Rally & Press Event to Demand the L.A. County Board of Supervisors Support Probation!

- An average of 25 officers a month are being assaulted by justice-involved youth in L.A. County Probation facilities every single month. That's 98% more assaults than our Sisters and Brothers at Orange County Probation. And we are 15 times more likely to be assaulted than those working in LASD* facilities.
- While youth on staff assaults are escalating, our profession is under attack by our very own bosses – the L.A. County Board of Supervisors.
- This was bad enough, but now the County has posted three positions in the newly-created Department of Youth Development (DYD) – Ambassador, Specialist, and Supervisor – to do EXACTLY what we are already doing.
- But no degrees are required. No criminal background checks. And applicants need just one year of experience (two years for the Supervisor).
- Meanwhile, the pay range for these DYD positions is 19-46% more than professional, trained, and degreed Probation Department employees are making!
